
Top 5 Ways Outdoor Music Builds Character at Camp

1. Encourages Resilience

When campers experiment with rhythm and melody, mistakes become part of the process. They learn to try again, adapt, and enjoy the journey - key ingredients for resilience.

2. Promotes Teamwork

Creating music together naturally requires listening, cooperation, and timing. Outdoor instruments turn group play into meaningful moments of collaboration.



3. Sparks Independence

There's no single "right way" to play. Campers gain confidence as they explore freely, make independent choices, and discover their own sound.

4. Strengthens Relationships

Music helps bring people together. Shared rhythms, creative musical exchanges, and peaceful moments of reflection help to support empathy, connection, and trust among campers and staff.


5. Creates Everyday Teachable Moments

Musical Connections at Camp ASCCA, AL

Camp ASCCA, a leading inclusive summer camp run by Easterseals Alabama, has long used music to connect and uplift its campers. The camp partnered with Percussion Play to install a collection of outdoor musical instruments - creating a vibrant, accessible space where campers of all abilities could explore rhythm, melody, and self-expression.

The camp's mission is to provide joyful, inclusive experiences for individuals with disabilities. While music was already a core part of the camp's culture, Program Director Amber Cotney saw an opportunity to deepen its impact with accessible, sensory-friendly musical instruments that could be used outdoors. "Our camp is very music-focused," Amber explains. "Music is universal. It's therapeutic, engaging, and something all our campers can participate in, no matter their abilities."

With support from donor Cody Payne, manager of the band The Red Clay Strays - Amber discovered Percussion Play's outdoor instruments. Installed in a peaceful, tree-lined area, the instruments included [Chimes](#) for melodic exploration, [Drums](#) for rhythmic play, and [nature-inspired instruments](#) for sensory engagement.

These instruments are designed to be inclusive, weather-resistant, and easy to play, making them ideal for therapeutic and recreational use. Instruments were quickly integrated into daily camp activities, including group music therapy sessions, free play & exploration, and calm-down sensory regulation periods.

Camp staff used the instruments to support emotional development, fine motor skills, and social interaction among campers. Campers with sensory sensitivities or nonverbal communication found new ways to express themselves, parents reported increased confidence and emotional regulation in their children, and staff have discovered new ways to connect with campers and foster inclusion. One camper's mother shared that her son, who rarely engages with others, now runs straight to the music area each day and plays for nearly an hour.

Camp ASCCA plans to expand its musical offerings and deepen the integration of outdoor musical play into its therapeutic programming. The partnership with Percussion Play has created a lasting legacy of joy, inclusion, and creativity.

Rotary Youth Camp at Lee's Summit, MS

Since 1925, Rotary Youth Camp in Lee's Summit has welcomed more than 300,000 campers to its fully accessible facilities overlooking Lake Jacomo. The camp provides inclusive outdoor adventures like tree climbing, tie-dye crafts, slumber parties, and now, thanks to one Girl Scout's vision, the joy of outdoor music-making.

Girls Can Camp, a unique program hosted at Rotary Youth Camp, is designed specifically for girls with disabilities and their friends. Its mission is to ensure every camper experiences nature, friendship, and fun in a safe, welcoming environment.

Many campers at Rotary Youth Camp have limited access to musical instruments in their daily lives. Program leaders sought new ways to encourage creative expression and sensory engagement while keeping activities inclusive for children of all abilities.



The idea for a dedicated Percussion Park came from Girl Scout and pianist Paige Thomas, who chose Rotary Youth Camp as the site for her Gold Award project. Paige devoted more than 80 hours to planning, fundraising, and partnering with the Rotary Club to make the project a reality. After careful research, Paige selected instruments from Percussion Play for their accessibility, durability, and universal appeal. They included [Rainbow Sambas](#), [Tropical Cyclone](#), [Rainbow Cavatina](#) and [Rainbow Chimes](#).

The new Percussion Park has transformed Rotary Youth Camp into a place where music can be enjoyed by everyone, regardless of ability. Campers are now exploring rhythm, sound, and movement in ways that support both therapeutic and developmental growth. This enables campers with mobility or sensory challenges to engage in music-making that promotes relaxation, improves mood, stimulates cognitive and emotional responses, and supports the development of fine and gross motor skills as well as sensory integration.

For generations to come, campers will discover the joy of making music outdoors - adding rhythm, harmony, and fun to the camp's long-standing tradition of nature, friendship, and possibility.

Music Garden at JCC Camp Centerland, NY

By a quiet creek in Amherst, New York, Alex Eadie, the Senior Director of Advancement at the Jewish Community Centre of Greater Buffalo (JCC), can hear the faint sound of bells and chimes as he walks up the path by the creek into the Irving M. Shuman Campground.

This 20-acre site is home to Camp Centerland, one of the largest summer day camps in Western New York and a top-200 summer camp in the United States, as named by Newsweek magazine in 2024. Serving children aged 5 - 15, Camp Centerland offers a host of activities, including swimming, archery, sports, crafts, and, of course, music.

The JCC and Camp Centerland is an ever-growing community, and its leaders recently realized the need to expand their offerings to campers. The leadership team identified how to add more elements for children to enjoy, and today, outdoor music-making is now on offer at the new Music Garden.

The children who attended camp were able to explore different outdoor instruments and the traditional music offerings in the camp's music program. The Music Pavilion (called the Shirah in Hebrew) is now surrounded by a garden of instruments - some inspired by nature!

Reflecting the natural surroundings of the campground, such as the wooded areas, trails, and creeks, Percussion Play's Flowers and Petal Drums are situated in the garden and provide a colorful focal point that engages campers of all ages.

The JCC also added [Rainbow Chimes](#), a [Rainbow Metallophone](#) and two sets of [Rainbow Bongos](#) to round out the ensemble, meaning that the camp has been filled with the sound of music - from the beat of drums to the gentle ringing of chimes, there's something everyone can enjoy.

Inclusive Outdoor Music Program at Camp Beausite, WA

Located near Port Townsend, Camp Beausite North West is a certified respite provider that operates year-round, offering camp experiences and respite opportunities for over 350 campers and 1,000 caregivers each year. For more than 30 years, the camp has dedicated itself to serving the special needs community. Founded in 1989, Camp Beausite was created in response to the lack of inclusive camp experiences. Its mission focuses on inclusivity by providing summer and weekend camp programs throughout the year.

The management team decided to create a new musical program for campers, aiming to provide a unique, fun, and exciting experience that is different from what other camps offer. They chose to develop an outdoor music area, and Raina Baker, the Executive Director of Camp Beausite, led the initiative to install a variety of outdoor musical instruments sourced from Percussion Play. The collection includes the [Alto Quartet Ensemble](#), [Congas Trio](#), [Emperor Chimes](#), and [Alto Diatonic Freechimes](#).

Raina used Percussion Play's innovative app, [Composer AR](#), which is the first of its kind in Augmented Reality (AR). This app has revolutionized how communities design and support spaces with outdoor musical instruments, helping to create a shared vision for music-making. With Composer AR, Raina was able to visualize her musical project even before the instruments were installed.

The app allows users to place any Percussion Play instrument within a real-life setting, in real-time, and play them. It also features an interactive component, enabling users to listen to the sound of each instrument as they play it within the app. Composer AR can be downloaded from the App Store or Google Play Store.


Magical Music Garden at Chartwell Happy Day Camp, NJ

Chartwell Happy Day Camp has made significant investments to enhance its creative arts programs, which includes a wide range of percussion instruments. The camp already boasts a Performing Arts Center area and stage, as well as its Monarch Butterfly Sanctuary, to help save the endangered butterfly and educate about their life cycle.

Outdoor musical instruments from Percussion Play are now part of the interactive initiative by the team at Chartwell Happy Day Camp. The team created an area within its 15 acres called Chartwell's Magical Musical Garden to help make it a fun and inviting area. The campers now migrate over to the area during their free time to play the instruments.

Since the installation, the camp counselors have been taking campers to the area to play the instruments.


They have also introduced the gardens to the parents and had a drone video made with everyone playing and having fun to help promote Chartwell's Magical Musical Garden. They are in the process of incorporating the activity into their drama and music program at the camp.

James Johnston, Owner of Chartwell Happy Day Camp, comments, "At the American Camp Association Convention in Orlando, we came across Percussion Play and their range of outdoor musical instruments. Camp Courageous is a non-profit organization providing year-round recreational and respite care opportunities for individuals with special needs. For nearly 50 years, the team at Camp Courageous has looked for unique and different ways to reach all of their campers who each have additional educational and physical needs, and their most recent addition, a musical park, is proving to have a particularly remarkable impact.

According to Amy Kurth, program director, the idea of an outdoor musical space took root over two years ago when she first joined Camp Courageous. She had researched the idea and could immediately see the benefits for their camp guests. Through a variety of fundraisers, grants, and sponsors, the local Monticello Rotary Club was able to support the project with a view to donating more instruments in the future.

The instruments would clearly be ideal to help bolster the camp's vision of inclusivity, supporting a wide range of people with disabilities of all ages from 4 to 104!

Taking into account the range of ages and abilities, Percussion Play recommended a suitable collection of instruments that would appeal to younger and older individuals.
