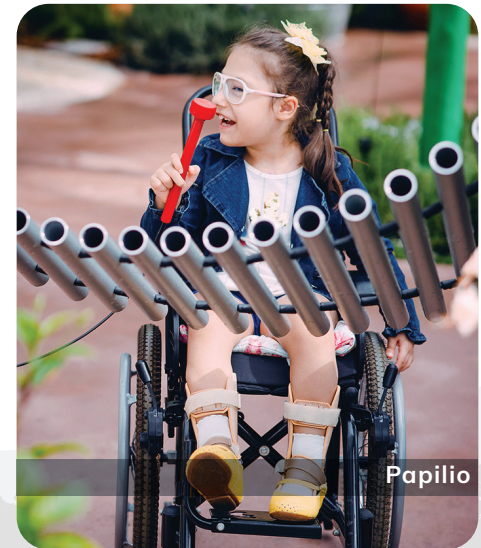
Health, Wellness & Belonging

This universal accessibility helps remove barriers to engagement and supports inclusive environments where everyone feels welcome.

Research continues to highlight the positive impact music can have on mood, cognition, social connection, and quality of life. From parks and playgrounds to healthcare settings, senior living communities, and public spaces, outdoor musical instruments provide meaningful opportunities for engagement that contribute to happier, healthier, and more connected communities.



Music for Youth at Hamilton Park, WI

In the city of Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, children can discover music and learn to play well-known tunes in the great outdoors, thanks to one local student's love of music and desire to give back to her community.

College student Natalie Johnson's Girl Scout Gold Award project, "Music for Youth," brings outdoor musical instruments to Hamilton Park, a popular space for the local Boys and Girls Club. The project provides children with easy access to music-making, with retired music teachers helping to introduce them to music and musical scales.

As a teaching aide at the Boys and Girls Club, Natalie is passionate about creating a space where children can explore music and play alongside parents and grandparents. Supported by a local business and the City of Fond du Lac, the project features a wide range of outdoor musical instruments, creating the largest outdoor music garden in the area.



Rosita's Harmony Hills in Sesame Place Seaworld, San Diego

Sesame Place is the newest theme park to open in California and the second theme park of its kind in the United States, and the perfect getaway for families and kids of all ages.

The theme park is full of immersive experiences and now offers guests a chance to use their imagination and practice their musical skills on various chimes and bells. During a day at the park, guests can spend time at Rosita's Harmony Hills, a soft play area for younger guests, which includes Percussion Play's outdoor musical instruments. Children can climb, crawl, and create beautiful music while playing on rolling green hillsides. The ability to play together... Rosita's Harmony Hills is a brightly colored, soft play area where kids can try different tune combinations and make music on various percussion instruments. The site was designed as an interactive play experience where children can explore and enjoy the harmonious musical instruments while also serving as a place to relax between soaring and spinning on rides and splishing and splashing on water slides.

Percussion Play's instruments were a great choice because of the selection of both traditional-looking instruments and instruments that are inspired by nature, which helped create a beautiful space for everyone to explore and enjoy. Musical instruments were chosen particularly because Sesame Street's Rosita loves to play guitar and create music with her Sesame Street friends. Fun Fact: The Calypso Chimes at Rosita's Harmony Hills include the nine notes needed to play the beloved Sunny Days theme song from Sesame Street.

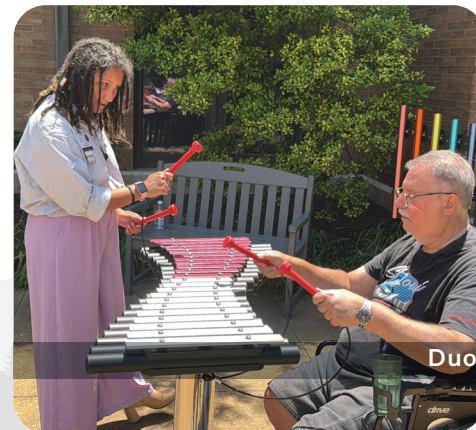
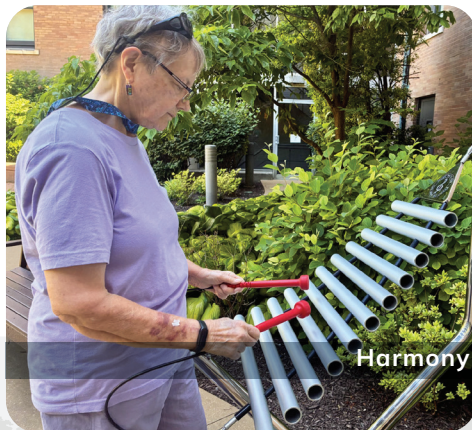


Laclede Groves' Harmony Garden, MO

At the heart of the music therapy program, the Harmony Garden hosts one-on-one sessions and sing-alongs, providing a great motor exercise using the upper body and hand-eye coordination. Many residents with dementia are also enjoying the instruments and the opportunity to make music together.

Laclede Groves also uses the garden to welcome the wider Webster Groves community. Through a partnership with a local Lutheran school, students visit residents and share the Harmony Garden, creating special intergenerational opportunities. Emily says, "This illustrates the connections being built and being made stronger between generations."

Emily is inspiring fellow music therapists who didn't think this would be possible and hopes to expand the program to other Lutheran Senior Services communities. The aesthetics of the instruments were also important, with the vibrant Rainbow Collection and nature-inspired Harmony Flowers helping to create an inviting space that draws people in.



ADA Music Garden for Park Hill Elementary, KS

Park Hill Elementary, part of Derby Public Schools, received ADA-compliant playground equipment thanks to the passing of a bond that will eventually ensure inclusive play is achievable in all nine elementary schools within the district, with Park Hill becoming the community's only music-themed playground.

Prior to the bond, only one school within the district had an accessible playground. Recognizing that inclusive play is a vital component of a school's development, the Derby Public Schools Board of Education approved funding to install inclusive playground equipment at each of the district's nine elementary schools.

Park Hill Elementary Principal Sandy Rusher was sold on the concept of developing a musical-themed ADA-accessible play space as soon as she spotted a picture of the colorful Rainbow Sambas from Percussion Play.

Park Hill serves kindergarten through 5th Grade and multiple Special Education programs, so accessibility was a key consideration in the design process. The layout and surfacing allow any child – regardless of ability or mobility device – to move freely, access the outdoor musical instruments, and play alongside other students, including on a Baby Floor Piano where students can compose music as they jump, run, dance, walk or wheel across the keys.



Shaunavon, Saskatchewan: A Community in Tune

Nestled in the heart of southwest Saskatchewan, the town of Shaunavon has long been a hub for creativity, culture, and community spirit. That spirit is now resonating – quite literally – thanks to an outdoor musical installation at the Grand Coteau Heritage and Cultural Centre, the town's cultural heartbeat.

Known for its museum, art gallery, and vibrant public programming, the Centre added a selection of Percussion Play instruments to its grounds, including the Large Babel Drum, Pentatonic Tembos, Diatonic Symphony Freechimes, and Bell Lyre. Chosen for their accessibility, sculptural beauty, and rich blend of tones, the instruments invite everyone to create spontaneous music.

The installation has quickly become a favourite gathering spot for families, school groups, and visitors. From curious children to long-time residents, everyone who passes by can stop, listen, and play, bringing people together through music and adding to Shaunavon's strong sense of community.

Palm Harbor Library's Outdoor Music Garden, FL

Palm Harbor Library has a long history of promoting and supporting the visual and performing arts. From curated artwork and a Children's Art MakerSpace to community partnerships and musical instruments for loan, the library continues to find creative ways to make the arts accessible. Its outdoor Musical Garden is another example of this commitment, encouraging people of all ages and abilities to come together, make music, and be creative.

The idea was born during the Covid pandemic, when Library Director Gene Coppola and his team began exploring new ways to serve the community safely. With concerns around gathering indoors, they saw an opportunity to bring the arts outside, creating a space where residents could continue to enjoy music. As Gene explains, "It was during this dark time that opportunity rather than despair presented itself."

Located alongside the library's Reading Garden, six Percussion Play instruments create an inviting musical experience, including the Bell Lyre, Rainbow Cavatina, Cyclone, Rainbow Bongos, Sunflower Petal Drums, and Harmony Bells. The Musical Garden was made possible through the estate of Dorothy and Frank Greenstreet, whose generous support of the library and its musical programs continues to highlight the importance of the arts within the community.
